Career Awards in Tobacco Control Regulatory Research

- The NIH, via support from the FDA Center for Tobacco Products (CTP), intends to fund approximately 28 – 33 Career Award applications in fiscal year 2014.
- There are four separate Funding Opportunity Announcements for these opportunities

Career Awards in Tobacco Control Regulatory Research: Key Dates

- Letter of Intent is due on or before
September 2, 2013
- Applications must be received on or before
October 2, 2013
- Earliest possible start date will be July 1, 2014



Career Awards in Tobacco Control Regulatory Research: Letter of Intent

- Due on or before September 2, 2013
- Includes the following:
 - Descriptive title of proposed research
 - Name, address, and telephone number of the PI
 - Names of other key personnel
 - Participating institution(s)
 - Number and title of this funding opportunity



Career Awards in Tobacco Control Regulatory Research:

- K01: Mentored award, 3-5 years
- K08: Mentored award, 3-5 years
- K22: non-mentored, three years, expected to apply for NIH or other independent research project grant support (R01 or equivalent) prior to the end of the 2nd year of support
- K99: mentored K99 for 1-2 years, followed by independent R00 phase of up to 3 years



Career Awards in Tobacco Control Regulatory Research: PI Appointment & Allowable Costs

- “Full time” appointment at the applicant institution.
- Devote a minimum of 9 person-months (75% of full-time professional effort)
- Salary up to \$90,000 plus associated fringe benefits
- Research support costs up to \$60,000
- F&A 8%
- For K99-R00 applications: R00 phase may not exceed \$249,000 per year, to include salary, FB, research support allowance and applicable F&A



Career Awards in Tobacco Control Regulatory Research: Post-award

- Interim progress report at six months following the project/budget start dates
- Excluded from streamlined reporting (SNAP)
- All carryover requests require prior approval
